### Cameron County Confirms Additional COVID-19 Related Death

Cameron County has received confirmation of an additional COVID-19 related death of a Cameron County resident. The resident was a 21-year old female from Indian Lake and a previously reported case. This raises the number of COVID-19 related deaths in Cameron County to 50.

Cameron County has also received confirmation of an additional 111 case reports of COVID-19. This includes the following:

This raises the total number of COVID-19 cases to 1,758 in Cameron County. There have also been an additional sixty (60) individuals who have recovered, raising the total number of recovered individuals to 1,062.

Cameron County Public Health continues to work with the four nursing home facilities in addressing the COVID-19 outbreaks. To date, the Cameron County cases arising from the Veranda Nursing Home has included 35 employees and 63 residents who have tested positive, including 11 who have passed away. Spanish Meadows in Brownsville also has 6 employees and 11 residents who have tested positive, including 2 who have passed away. The Rio at Fox Hollow in Brownsville has 7 employees and 18 residents who have tested positive. Alta Vista in Brownsville has 1 employee and 3 residents who have tested positive. In addition, Port Isabel Service Processing Center has 7 employees and 53 detainees who have tested positive.

As part of the COVID-19 action response plan, Cameron County Public Health is conducting epidemiological investigations, contact tracing as needed, and continues to monitor the situation.
